

# **Parent Concern Management Process**

At Springside Primary School, we place a significant value on developing a strong partnership between families and our education staff as we know the positive impact that this relationship has on student outcomes. As a school, we are here to support every student and every family in any way that we can. With this in mind, we are always striving to improve our processes to ensure that we can support families appropriately and address any parent concerns in a timely and efficient manner.

On the next page, you will see our Parent Concern Management Process. This process illustrates how parent concerns are managed here at Springside. As always, your first port of call is the classroom teacher as they will have the best relationship and understanding of your child. If the teacher is unable to resolve your concern or requires further support, there are numerous leaders within our school that they can work with. This includes our Team Leaders, Teaching and Learning Coaches and the Principal Class. Depending on the nature of your concern, you may be referred to people with specific expertise, such as our Child Safe Officer or Inclusion and Early Identification Co-Ordinator. Regardless of who follows up with you, they will be working closely with the classroom teacher to support your child so please make sure your concern begins with them.

# STATEMENT OF COMMITMENT TO CHILD SAFETY AND CHILD SAFETY PRINCIPLES

Springside Primary School is dedicated to the protection of all children from all forms of child abuse. At Springside Primary School we demonstrate this commitment through the implementation of a comprehensive Child Safe Program. The program is endorsed by the school governing authority and is periodically reviewed for its effectiveness. We encourage external scrutiny, enabling the identification of opportunities for improvement. We have clear and high expectations of behaviour for all staff, students and our wider community members. Particular attention will be paid to the cultural safety of Aboriginal children and children from culturally and/or linguistically diverse backgrounds, as well as the safety of children with a disability.

At Springside Primary School we maintain a child safe culture that:

- has zero tolerance for any forms of child abuse
- o is dedicated to acting in all children's best interests and to keeping them safe from harm at all times
- is committed to providing the necessary resources and training to guarantee compliance with all relevant child protection laws and regulations
- engages only the most suitable people to work with children to provide high quality staff and volunteer supervision
- o actively works to listen to and empower children
- o has protocols and policies to protect children from abuse and take all allegations and concerns seriously
- o responds to children consistently in line with the school's policies and procedures
- o is committed to promoting the physical, emotional and cultural safety for all children
- o is committed to providing a safe environment for all children at all times.

Springside Primary School values are Respect, Optimism, Responsibility and Excellence.

- Respect We respect ourselves, our school and each another, and understand that our attitudes and behaviours have an impact on the people around us.
- Optimism We model and demonstrate Optimism by being hopeful and having confidence about the future and our success.
