ATTENDANCE

Having your child at school is crucial to success and wellbeing. If your child is absent, we kindly ask for a same day notification of absence.

If your child is sick or absent, you are required to notify their school as soon as possible **on the day of absence** using one of the following methods:

- 1. **Compass:** log the absence directly using the Compass app.
- 2. **Telephone 9449-6400:** the school office and let the staff know your child's name, class, date of absences and reason.
- 3. **Email:** the school and provide the staff with your child's name, class, date of absences and reason.

Notifying the school of your child's absence either prior to, or on the day that they will be away, helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of children and will fulfil your legal responsibility.

Why do I need to notify the school if my child is absent?

Schools need to know when and why a child is absent, and you need to know if your child isn't at school. Since the end of Term 2 2018, all Victorian government schools are required to contact parents/carers as soon as practicable on the same day of an unexplained student absence. If your child is absent on a particular day and you have not contacted the school to explain why, the absence will be marked as unexplained. This system also promotes daily school attendance.

What is your responsibility?

You are legally required to ensure your child attends school every day or you must provide an explanation for their absence. You should let the school know in advance of any upcoming absences or let them know in

the morning if your child won't be at school. In order for schools to implement the same day notification requirement, it's essential that you provide the school with your most up-to-date contact details.

What is the school's responsibility?

The school must notify you of an unexplained absence in relation to your child as soon as practicable on the same day. Schools will let you know either by your school's online communications app, SMS, phone call or email. If you can't be reached because the school does not have your correct contact details (i.e. changed phone number, SMS/email failure notification received etc.), the school will attempt to make contact with any emergency contact/s nominated on your child's file held by the school. Where possible, this contact will be made on the same day of the unexplained absence.

Where can I learn more about the process for managing student absences?

Ask your school for a copy of the *Attendance Policy* which outlines the school's processes and procedures for monitoring, recording and following-up of student absences.


We love to learn and in 1C we RORE!

During Term 1 Grade 4C has been very busy! We have worked really hard in all areas of our learning and are really proud of what we have achieved.

In our integrated unit we worked in small groups to create a service or building that formed part of a class community. Our community was called 4C Reserve. We worked in groups of four and elected a council member to represent us at a local level. We created hospitals, universities, parks, houses and even a sewage plant! 


6C

What a fabulous, yet long, term it has been. I think (I know), that all students and myself are looking forward to a lovely break. This term, we spent a great deal of time on narrative writing, all the while reading our classroom novel, "Wonder," which was part of our Literacy program. The students have produced some fantastic pieces themselves reflecting on all that they have learned this term. Today the students had the opportunity to watch the movie itself and make comparisons between the novel and movie. Watching the movie brought about closure to our book and unit of learning for this term. Some of us were even caught tearing up watching it. Congratulations to our class on all the hard work put in this term.

SENSATIONAL SCIENCE with Mr Beszelzen and Mrs Brooker

In Science this term, the Preps have been introduced to the science room and the rules that apply. They have also been learning how to work in teams when doing practical investigations. The topic of investigation this term has been motion. Using toys, students explored how a push or pull force is needed for objects to move. They have also investigated the way objects move, specifically roll and slide, and how this depends on a variety of factors such as the shape of the object. Students were able to use their knowledge to describe their movements as they played on the playground, as push or pulls. The students were also introduced to the concept of gravity and how it assisted objects to roll or slide down ramps. The students enjoyed exploring the science of motion which culminated in them making a moving Humpty Dumpty toy.





In science this term, the Grade 1 students have enjoyed learning about sound and light. They investigated sound using musical instruments and were able to observe vibrations that are created when sound is produced. The students explored how the vibrations can travel through different medium such as the air, water, string and a table to get to our ears for us to hear.

Students also investigated light and its many sources and how light is needed for us to see objects and their colour.

The students enjoyed exploring the science of sound and light and especially enjoyed making a musical instrument to take home.

Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and Springside Primary School is excited to be participating. The PRC application offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
- a modern user-friendly interface
- rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved
- the option for students to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 8 September 2023.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.
